

**Design Architect – Wayfinding & Signage**  
**Architectural Design - Engineering Department**

Reporting to the Head - Architectural Design, the incumbent is responsible for the provision of professional architectural design and co-ordination of services related to Wayfinding and Signage for both new and existing TTC facilities. The primary duty of the Design Architect – Wayfinding and Signage will be directing the activities of technical staff as well as external consultants. The incumbent coordinates the activities of the wayfinding and signage group to ensure the timely completion of quality work, the adequacy of designs produced by the group in terms of safety, constructability, maintainability and cost effectiveness as well as ensuring technical accuracy and compliance with all relevant codes. The Design Architect – Wayfinding and Signage will take responsibility for the design and technical content of documents by applying architectural seal and signature as required by code. The incumbent will also engage in some technical work by preparing architectural designs. Annual Salary Range: \$71,380.40 – 89,271.00 (Level 9)

Must have working knowledge of current versions of MicroStation, CorelDraw, Photoshop, Excel, and Microsoft Office Suite. Must possess sound judgment; excellent graphic design skills; well-developed analytical, problem solving, verbal communication and demonstrated ability to coordinate the efforts of others to accomplish objectives. The incumbent must be a registered member in good standing with the Ontario Association of Architects or the equivalent combined with progressive experience in the Wayfinding and Signage industry.

Must have or rapidly acquire a comprehensive knowledge of the Ontario Human Rights Code and Related Orders including disability accommodation and accessibility requirements pertaining to passengers and employees.
