



CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

Appointment to the Transportation Association of Canada Traffic Operations and Management Standing Committee

The Canadian Institute of Transportation Engineers (CITE) is inviting applications to serve as one of its five representatives on the Transportation Association of Canada (TAC) Traffic Operations and Management Standing Committee (TOMSC). The term of the appointment commences on January 1, 2012 and ends on December 31, 2014. CITE may consider extending the appointment for a further two years (two, one year extensions) depending on the individual's level of participation on the committee.

Position Overview:

TOMSC is comprised of representatives from provincial and territorial road authorities, municipal governments, and interested associations. The Committee is responsible for organizing, stimulating and coordinating research for the improvement of traffic control devices and practices in Canada; and conducting workshops, distributing educational and public information materials, and carrying out such other activities as may be desirable to disseminate information relating to recommended traffic control practices. Qualifications:

Desirable candidates have had a significant number of years of experience with road authorities in the application of traffic control devices. Candidates may currently be working for a road authority, or have previously worked for a road authority and are still employed in the transportation engineering profession. Individuals from academia and private practice who have demonstrated experience and knowledge in the application of traffic control devices may also apply.

Candidates must be ITE members and members of TAC through their employers to be eligible.

Expectations:

Appointees are expected to:

- Attend the twice-yearly meetings of the Committee. Individuals missing more than two successive meetings may be asked to step down.
- Participate on project committees.
- Finance all travel expenses and time costs required to attend meetings and participate on committees. CITE provides each appointee a travel subsidy of up to \$1,000 annually to help defray costs.
- Remain a CITE member in good standing throughout the period of the appointment.

- Collaborate with the other CITE appointees to write an article for Transportation Talk following each meeting.
- Take an active role in supporting the Canadian Capacity Guide for Signalized Intersections at the Committee.
